Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 10th day of May 1865, at Luxington Ky, in Co. "H", 119th Regiment of U. S. Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "H" of that Regiment, for the months of May and June 1865, he is reported "Died June 3rd 65 in Gene Hospital Camp Nelson Ky" and is so accounted for on the Muster Roll of Co. (Cause of death Typhoid Fever)

WIDOW'S CLAIM FOR PENSION.

ON THIS 9th day of August, 1869, personally appeared before me, a clerk of a Court of Record in and for the County and State aforesaid, Rada Reynolds a resident of Stokes and State of North Carolina aged 45 years, who being duly sworn, makes the following declaration, in order to obtain the Pension provided by the Act of Congress approved July 14, 1862. That she is the widow of Myler Reynolds who was a private in Company H commanded by Capt. Evan O. Kennedy in the 119th Regiment of United States Cold Troops in the War of 1861; that her maiden name was Rada Reynolds and that she was married to said Myler Reynolds on or about the 25th day of December 1849, at Patrick and State of Virginia by and that she knows of no record evidence of said marriage. It not being usual at that time to keep record evidence of the marriage of persons

SHE FURTHER DECLARES that said Myler Reynolds her husband, died in the service of the United States as aforesaid at Camp Nelson in the State of Kentucky on or about the 3rd day of June 1864, of Fever

She also declares that she has remained a widow ever since the death of said Myler Reynolds and that she has not in any manner been engaged in, or aided or abetted, the rebellion in the United States; and she hereby appoints R. W. Walker of Washington City, D.C. as her lawful Attorney, with power of substitution, and authorizes him to present and prosecute this claim, and to receive her pension certificates. The following the name, date, of birth and place, of residence of all the children of her deceased husband who were under sixteen years of age at the time of his death.

Ann aged 14, Mariah 12, Lintha 13, Malinda 11, Columbus 10, Nancy Jane 8, Emily 7 1/2, Myler 5 years and all reside with me in Stokes Co N.C.
